Through paying your fees, you become a member of your archery club, but that's not all. You also become a member of Berkshire Archery Association (the County), Southern Counties Archery Association (the Region), and Archery GB too.

Berkshire Archery Association is made up of:



The objective of Berkshire Archery Association is to promote and encourage the sport of Archery within the County of Berkshire as existing in 1972. The County is part of the Archery GB governance structure, and provides support for clubs and their members in the following areas:

- Memberships and record keeping
- Support and guidance for archers and clubs
- 2 Safeguarding and verification of identification documents for DBS checks
- News, communications and GDPR
- Disciplinary matters and complaint handling
- Managing County funds, equipment or property
- Events and competitions
- ? Coaching opportunities
- 2 Judges and volunteers

- County Records, ranking and team selections

Below is a bit more detail about some of the things we do to support and develop archery in the County. There are always opportunities to get involved if you're interested.

BAA Archery Records:

Any member of Berkshire Archery Association can submit their scores through their club. If you are a leisure archer, shooting for your own enjoyment, you will be able to see how you are doing compared with fellow archers across the County. BAA runs a Leisure Ranking List online.

For the more adventurous/competitive archers, clubs and the BAA may hold open tournaments. These are open to anyone, of any level, age and ability, and are a great way to expand your archery experiences. To be eligible to represent the County at inter-county shoots or nationally, you can submit your relevant qualifying scores through your club to the County Records Officer.

Coaching: Berkshire Archery Coaching Group (BACG)

Coaching activity within the county is led by the County Coaching Organiser and the Berkshire Archery Coaching Group (BACG).

"Coaching is about unlocking a person's potential to maximize their own performance (Whitmore, 2002)"

Your club may well have coaching available for its members, through its own club coaches or arranged coaching activity. Besides this, the BACG provides coaching for individual archers and for groups of archers through improvement programmes, seminars and workshops to enhance the skills of adults and junior archers within Berkshire.

The Coaching Group also provides coach training through a structured learning and qualification route. Recognised coaching levels are available from the raw beginner instruction through to high-level performance improvement. Lastly, the Coaching Group provide continuous education and professional development training to the coaching community.

Judging:

We have a small judging team within Berkshire that is available to help to support opportunities to advance your knowledge and attain qualification in the rules and conduct of competition archery. All tournaments require judges of the right level and if you're interested in getting involved, there are opportunities. It's a good way to meet other archers and extend your archery experience.

Volunteering within BAA:

All the clubs and the Berkshire Archery Association are run by volunteers. Some of the volunteers have official titles and roles, but many don't, and everyone's efforts are really appreciated, and really important for the continuation of the sport.

The BAA committee consists of 16 positions, three of which are an executive committee (details can be found below), but we also value the participation from club representatives. Secretary: Celia Stocker (Windsor Forest)	Hi, I am Celia, I am the Secretary. I am the point of contact for the County, organize the County meetings and promote the BAA.
Treasurer: Thomas Clint (Archways TDH)	Hey, as treasurer I manage the finances of the BAA and administer the membership fees of the members.
Gentlemen Vice-President: Graham Potts (Bowmen of Burleigh)	The Gentleman Vice President is a member of the committee and helps to promote the BAA as necessary and support the President.
*Lady Vice President: Jane Burnham (Bowmen of Burleigh)	As Lady Vice President I am a member of the committee and help to promote the BAA as necessary and support the President as required.
Records Officer: John Kelly (Bowmen of Warfield)	I am the county records officer. I receive scores from club records officers. I collate these scores and publish rankings on the county website. I am also involved in selecting a team to represent the county in some national competitions.

*Junior Representative: Emma Evans (Bowmen of Burleigh) Coaching Organiser: Gary Critchlow-Smith (BACG) Judges Representative: Graham Potts	Hiya, my name is Emma and I am the Junior Rep for Berkshire. My main role is to encourage as many juniors to shoot and have fun. Hopefully, an off shoot of this will be to nurture a competitive team to represent the county and have fun in the process. Safeguarding officer: Mike Hogg (AGB)	This position has the responsibility for the Safeguarding of children and young adults, also adults at risk, within the Berkshire Archery Association
*Match Secretary Position Vacant	Is the point of contact for the organisation of intercounty events, and the relevant Team Selections.
2x SCAS Representative Celia Stocker (Windsor Forest) *-Position Vacant	Attend and represent the County at Regional meetings. Feeding back news and changes to the committee for distribution to the club secretary's.
Tournament Organiser (Indoors) Richard Stainthorpe (Crowthorne)	To organise on behalf of the County an indoor tournament for the members of Berkshire Archery Association.
*Tournament Organiser (Outdoors) Gary Critchlow-Smith (BACG)	To organise on behalf of the County an outdoor tournament for the members of Berkshire Archery Association.
*Tournament Organiser (Field) Position Vacant	To organise on behalf of the County a field tournament for the members of Berkshire Archery Association.
